BA4SC – BELGIAN ALLIANCE FOR SUSTAINABLE CONSTRUCTION

Woluwe-Saint-Pierre, June 15, 2022 - The Belgian actors of the construction world were present yesterday evening, in company of the advisor of Zakia Khattabi, Minister of Climate, Environment, Sustainable Development and Green Deal, to launch a new alliance for sustainable development: BA4SC.

The construction sector has a major role to play in sustainable development. Aware of the challenges, the various players, from materials suppliers to architects and design offices, as well as large companies and players in real estate, have already taken numerous initiatives. With BA4SC, they intend to move up a gear by taking advantage of their structural interdependence to move forward together, to go faster and further.



A true systemic revolution

In fact, most of the sector's CO₂ emissions come from indirect sources, such as transport, production, materials, waste, etc. An alliance is the solution in order to take each individual actor into consideration as part of a system that must be rethought in its very logic, says Didier Cartage, director of ADEB-VBA, enthusiastically. As Einstein rightly said, "we cannot solve a problem with the same thinking we had when we created it". And the challenge is great since Belgium has committed to reducing its CO₂ emissions by 55% for 2030.



Together to accelerate the transition

Therefore the Alliance proposes a series of measures such as the sharing of effective initiatives already implemented in different regions, in other countries but also in other sectors, the distribution of different actions to optimize human and financial resources or the evolution of regulatory frameworks if necessary. If everyone actively contributes to the common effort, this networking that the Alliance aims to achieve will increase the positive impact of the construction sector and accelerate the sustainability transition to reach the 2030 and 2050 objectives," says Didier Cartage. And this is indeed what the different actors expressed last night during the launch event. Concretely, the BA4SC will meet on August 24 to launch the various working groups, taking into account both the needs of the sector and the priority areas for sustainable development.

Minister Zakia Khattabi adds that "the buildings you build today are also the mines of the future. Therefore, a building should not be built only for its first life. It must be designed in such a way that the building components are already ready for a second life. This requires appropriate materials and construction techniques. Buildings should be constructed to be easily dismantled. In this way, the materials retain their value. This prevents them from being wasted. And that no new raw materials are needed for the next building. This requires a different design philosophy and extensive cooperation throughout the chain."
